



Monthly Update: Enrollment Figures in the Medicaid and CHIP Eligibility Operations and Enrollment Snapshot

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released the Iatest for Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). CMS releases the Medicaid and CHIP Eligibility Operations and Enrollment Snapshot on a monthly-basis, providing current month and retrospective data to convey a national and state-specific picture of Medicaid and CHIP eligibility operations and enrollment.
